

### **RISKS**



Creation of a pre-screening mechanism to review the applications for international protection at external borders: procedural guarantees could be compromised due to the tight deadlines. The responsibility could lie exclusively with the Southern border Member States.



Lack of an agreement on safe disembarkation and mandatory relocation.



Adoption of agreements with third countries where migrants and refugees are not granted protection.



Increase of returns to unsafe countries.



Use of the situation caused by COVID-19 as an excuse to extend restrictive measures: closing of borders, suspension of resettlement, relocation and family reunification arrangements, increased difficulty in safely disembarking people rescued from the Mediterranean Sea.

# **OPPORTUNITIES**



Guaranteeing the principle of solidarity and fair sharing of responsibility between the Member States.



Promoting a guarantee-based Common European Asylum System.



Boosting and reinforcing the commitment to create safe and legal channels for refugees to access protection.



Ensuring access to the asylum procedure with every guarantee.



Putting an end to "push-backs" and to the conditioning of development aid on border control.



Ensuring the saving of lives at sea and the improvement of search and rescue operations in the Mediterranean Sea, by promoting a safe and efficient disembarkation protocol with the subsequent mandatory relocation.



Ensuring that, even under exceptional circumstances such as the COVID-19 crisis, migrants have access to the territory and the asylum procedure, and that there is an adequate system of relocation and resettlement, with alternatives to detention.
